

What is Hampstead Park Neighborhood Association?

Have you ever wondered why you pay dues to both Hampstead Park Neighborhood Association (HPNA) and Haile Plantation West Association (HPW)? What is HPNA, and what is its purpose?

HPW was incorporated in 1990, and neighborhood construction began shortly thereafter. However, the governing documents did not allow HPW to enter onto private property to maintain landscaping, nor did they allow for the Association to own and maintain roads. Because documents are notoriously difficult to change or amend, the developer came up with another option: The creation of sub-Associations, like HPNA.

As the development group saw a niche in the market for patio style homes with common landscaping, decorative fencing, and other amenities, they needed a solution to allow for the Association to provide these services.

As a result, several sub-Associations were created in HPW, including HPNA. As a Florida notfor-profit corporation, HPNA has its own Board, Budget and Governing Documents. (Should you need a copy, please contact our Management Company for a FREE electronic copy).

HPNA owners represent 699 of the 1567 homes within HPW. Of these homes, 241, per our Documents, pay additional assessments to receive additional yard maintenance services.


HPNA, as an Association, owns and is responsible for 125,262 square feet of roads, 29 islands and 1,394 linear feet of fencing, all of which is maintained to the level that Haile residents have come to expect. Reserves have been set up and funded to meet future maintenance and replacement needs, so that our Association will not endure a special assessment for these responsibilities.

Finally, HPNA, per Florida statute, has its financials reviewed by an independent and licensed CPA, and has experienced many years of consistent approval, with no deficiencies.

The Board of Directors meets at least quarterly, often with additional meetings scheduled based on the year's projects, important updates, and required business. All meeting dates and times are posted on the Association's website to keep owners informed. Additionally, our Annual Meeting occurs in January of each year. Please join us!

Hampstead Park Neighborhood Association (HPNA) is 25 neighborhoods, which encompass 699 of the 1,567 homes in Haile Plantation West (HPW), our Master Association.



AT A GLANCE

All 699 Owners Pay for:

- Fences: 1,394 linear feet of picket fencing.
- Roads: 125,262 square feet of roads.
- Landscaping: 29 traffic islands and other common areas.

241* of the 699 Owners Pay for:

- Routine mowing, edging, trimming, and blowing.
- Pest control services and fertilization.

*As per the governing documents, owners may not opt in or out of yard services.

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QUARTERLY ASSESSMENTS

- Paid exclusively through the online payment portal found at HampsteadPark.org.
- Reminders sent by email--no coupon books mailed.
- Due on the 1st of January, April, July, and October.
- One-time payments, scheduled payments, and autopay options.
- Payment by bank draft (no charge) or credit card (2.99% processing charge) options.

NOT HPNA RESPONSIBILITY

As a sub-Association of HPW, HPNA does not:

- Review Architectural Review Board (ARB) submissions.
- Issue citations for covenant violations or levy fines.
- Collect dues to maintain non-HPNA amenities, such as the walking trails, Haile West Park, the basketball court on 44th Avenue, and non-HPNA commons, fences, etc.
